About GADAus

Gender and Disaster Australia or 'GADAus' is *the leading national organisation* offering evidence-based education, training, and resources to address and minimise the harmful impacts of gender stereotypes in disaster.

Primarily funded by the federal Department of Social Services under the *National Plan to End Violence Against Women and their Children*, GADAus has demonstrated expertise in gender and disaster research, training and policy, contributing to improved and more inclusive responses to increasing disasters across the country.

Promoting an understanding of the role of gender in survivor responses to disaster – including increased family violence – GADAus works to embed these insights into emergency management practice.

History and foundations

Established in 2015 as the GAD Pod, this work is *grounded in extensive qualitative research* by Dr Debra Parkinson, Claire Zara and others dating back to 2009 in the aftermath of the Black Saturday bushfires. Their research, *The Way He Tells It: Relationships after Black Saturday*, was the first of its kind in Australia to identify and examine the [link between disasters and violence against women](#).

Adding to the growing body of research globally that shows increased rates of gender-based violence (GBV) in disaster, the GAD Pod initiated a wide range of projects and research that has accelerated the knowledge, policy and practice of the gendered risks of disasters in Australia, including the impact on long-term disaster resilience.

In 2012, the GAD Pod hosted the first conference on natural disasters and family violence, *Identifying the Hidden Disaster*, in Melbourne, galvanising interest with key stakeholders for addressing gender in disaster. Following the Conference, the GAD Pod received an invitation from Monash University's Injury Research Institute (now MUDRI), leading to a successful partnership submission to the National Disaster Resilience Grants Scheme.

With new project funding, the GAD Pod expanded its focus to consider men's experiences during and after Black Saturday, culminating in the seminal research report: *Men and Black Saturday: Risks and opportunities for change* and subsequent *Just Ask: Men and Disaster Conference* (funded under the National Disaster Resilience Grant Scheme);

Since undertaking its foundational research, the GAD Pod has led a range of initiatives—with critical input from leaders and personnel in emergency management, academia, government and community — to inform responses to women and men in future disasters, including:

- *Gender and Disaster Taskforce 2014- 2016, auspiced by the Victorian Emergency Management Commissioner*
- *Barriers to women in fire and emergency leadership roles 2015 (commissioned by Victorian Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning)*
- *Collaborative development of National Gender and Emergency Management Guidelines 2015-16 (funded by NEMP)*
- *Long-term Disaster Resilience research 2017 (funded by NDRGS)*
- *Identifying the experiences and needs of LGBTI communities before, during and after emergencies in Victoria 2018 (commissioned by Victorian Department of Premier and Cabinet)*
- *Diversity in Disaster Conference, MCG, 2018 (funded by NDRGS)*
- *Research projects on the impact of COVID-19 on violence prevention (commissioned by Respect Victoria (2020-21).*
- *Gender Justice in Disaster Conference, 2020*
- *United to End Violence Against Women: GADAus and NORWACS, Lismore 2023*

2022 – a new national focus

Building on the decade of research and work under the GAD Pod, in 2022, the Federal Government made a [significant commitment to reducing violence against women](#) by funding this work on a national scale. GADAus is currently *working closely with key stakeholders* to embed gender-informed disaster preparation, response and recovery in practice.

Across each state and territory, the GADAus team develops and delivers a range of practice-based resources, case studies, events, and training packages both in-person and online to disaster responders, community members and other groups. Training has already *reached over 1,000 participants* from the emergency services sector, local government, women's health and faith-based organisations, and disaster-affected communities across the country.

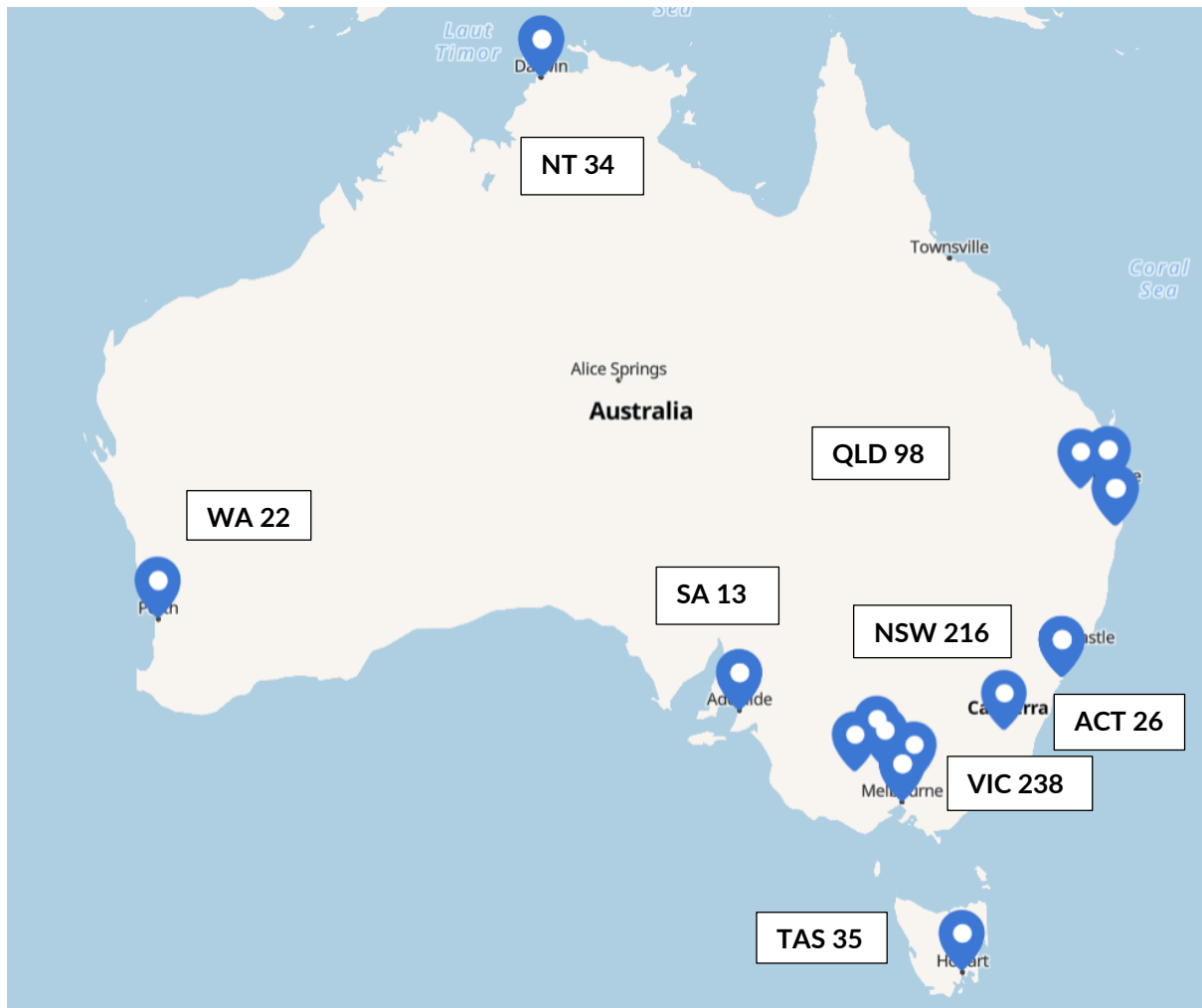
Training

GADAus expert trainers and experienced facilitators develop and deliver a range of practice-based resources, case studies, events, and training packages both in-person and online to disaster responders, community members and other groups across Australia.

The map below indicates locations of Lessons in Disaster training since funding to Gender and Disaster Australia was announced on 1 January 2022. Organisations implementing significant training have included the Red Cross, NEMA, and local governments across the country. Disaster-affected regions are well-represented in our training locations, including Mallacoota, the mid-coast of NSW, Central Victoria and Lismore.

The initial GADAus training team was led by Rachael Mackay, Steve O'Malley and Liam Leonard, and administered by Jaspreet Kaur and Asminah Cohen. Rachael leads the Train-the-Trainer program which has resulted in more than 60 people completing the training and 13 becoming accredited trainers.

The GAD Pod – Training Background 2013-2021

Under the banner of the GAD Pod, the training reached over 1,000 participants from the emergency services sector, local government, faith-based organisations, and disaster-affected communities from early trials in 2013 until 2021, mostly in Victoria.

The first training session on Family Violence After Disaster was initially developed and led by Claire Zara and Rachael Mackay, and this was quickly followed by the Men on Black Saturday session. Initial resistance from emergency management participants resulted in the introduction of male trainers – a reflection of the patriarchal context facing our work. Steve O'Malley and Andrew Wilson-Annan have taken on this role over many years. Early in the development of the training, Jan Earthstar co-developed (with GADAus) and delivered the session on LGBTIQ+ people in disasters. This element of the training was further developed over recent years by Liam Leonard. The research of Dale Dominey-Howes, Andrew Gorman-Murray and Scott McKinnon has informed this element of the training throughout.
